CONCEPT

We are in the process of developing a curriculum so that every disciple receives the same foundational teaching and training. This format will be done 2 times a year. At this rate, it will take 3 years to complete the 6 Levels that make up the Kingdom Training Classes. This will help everyone stay faithful and be fruitful.

Class Overview: This 6-week series challenges disciples to re-think God's sovereignty in our lives and our personal stewardship. Biblical stewardship can be defined as "handling all of God's resources God's ways for God's glory." As disciples in one of the wealthiest regions in one of the wealthiest countries of the world, we recognize materialism as a significant threat to our discipleship. By bringing this area of our lives under the Lordship of Christ, we have the ability to free ourselves from the "pattern of this world" (Rom 12:2) that consumes our joy, schedule, resources, and hearts so that we can have the capacity to be "generous on every occasion" (2 Cor 9:11).
